EVENING PROGRAM:

Cheri Strempel of the program committee announced a change in the speaker this evening. She introduced the "new "speaker, Geri Patterson-Kutras who had also offered a workshop earlier in the day on Boro, teaching a sashiko technique. This evening's presentation was about her love of architecture and history, and how she portrays it in her unique quilting artform. Her works are "structural" to the eye, but there are many surprises of whimsy and unexpected forms and color in her creations. She is a Morgan Hill resident and was very warmly received by the membership. She presented about a 50-minute trunk show and took questions about her techniques.

started. Sew Day will begin at 9:30 am for set-up and will start at 10 am. Clean-up will end at 4pm. Please bring your own lunch and if you want to come to do your own work, you are welcome to do that as well. Supplies for tying will be provided but bring your own scissors and thimble. Extra crochet cotton size #10 will be gladly accepted for donation. Batting is provided. A sewing machine will be helpful for doing envelope turns on quilts, bindings and piecing backings if necessary. A full day is planned.

Linda reminded the membership that June is the month we vote on where we want to donate our philanthropy quilts for year 2023. Suggestions for new or repeat recipient organizations are welcome to be put forward to be considered to receive the quilts (contact Linda Boman).
