## Block of the Month ~ September / October 2012

Makes a $10^{\prime \prime}$
finished block

## Hafloween Dinwheel

Color Al: Pale Green-cut two $21 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares and cut once diagonally
Color A2: Yellow-cut two $21 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares and cut once diagonally
Color A3: Orange-cut one 3 3/4" square and cut twice diagonally
Color A4: Pinky Purple - cut two 3 3/8" squares and cut once diagonally
Color A5: Dark Green-cut one $61 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ square and cut twice diagonally
Color A6: Dark Purple-cut two $57 / 8^{" s}$ squares and cut once diagonally


This block can be constructed in two ways; either cut the pieces exactly as listed above and sew taking care not to stretch the biased edges, or you can cut the fabric pieces a little larger and use the paper piecing template found on page 8. Paper piecing is a terrific way to get all the blocks exactly the same size! If you are unsure as to how to paper piece-come along to Quilts and Things on Tuesdays or Thursday afternoons for a quick demonstration from Louise :-)

## Regular Sewing Method

1. Sew together A1 and A2 in the orientation shown here:

2. Add A6 to the hypotenuse of A1 to A5 collectively
 the page.
3. Add A4 to the hypotenuse of A3

4. After you have made four of these blocksjoin them together like the block at the top of
5. Add A3 to the long (hypotenuse) edge of A2
